On December 16, 2015, students from Mount Vernon and Woodlands High Schools met at Mount Vernon High School to engage in a spirited and meaningful debate regarding the issue of Climate Change and Global Warming. Social Studies teacher, and adviser, for the Westchester (NY) Chapter of The Links, Mr. Mihailidis invited the Woodlands U.N./ Westchester County (NY) Chapter of The Links students to debate "*Climate Change*". All students participate in the L.I.F.E. program sponsored by the Links, Incorporated.

This discussion utilized the established Model U.N. process/practices and a collaborative effort that produced an engaging and enriching experience for all. Students were encouraged to talk through issues and learn from each other. Woodlands' students became familiar with the complex process of a Model U.N. through the guidance of the experienced Mount Vernon students.

"It was interesting to discuss global topics with other high school students, who were very knowledgeable about global issues".

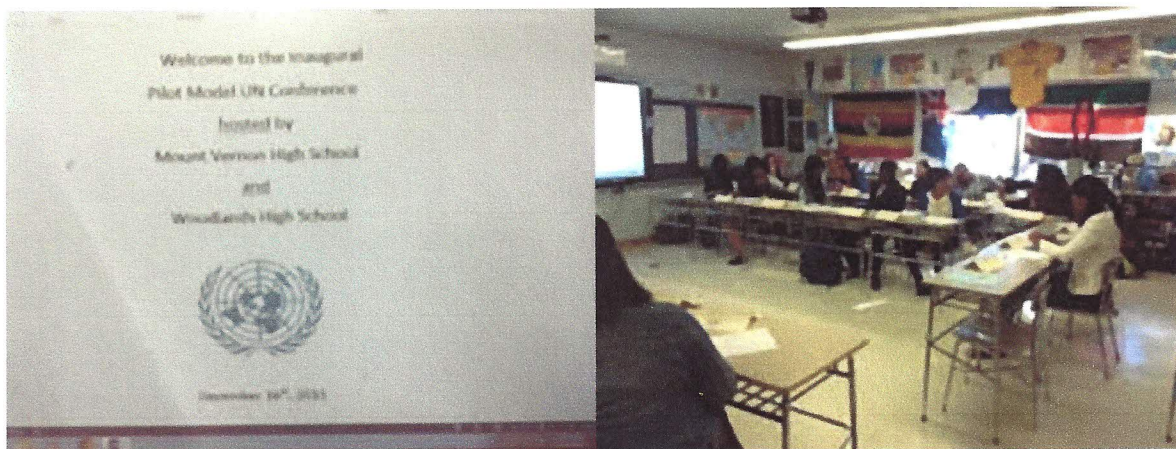

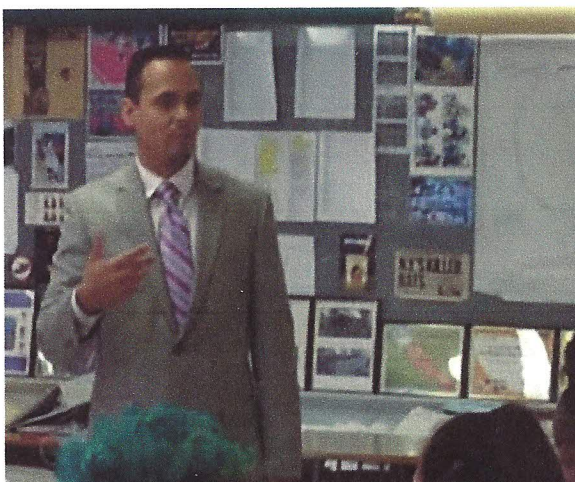

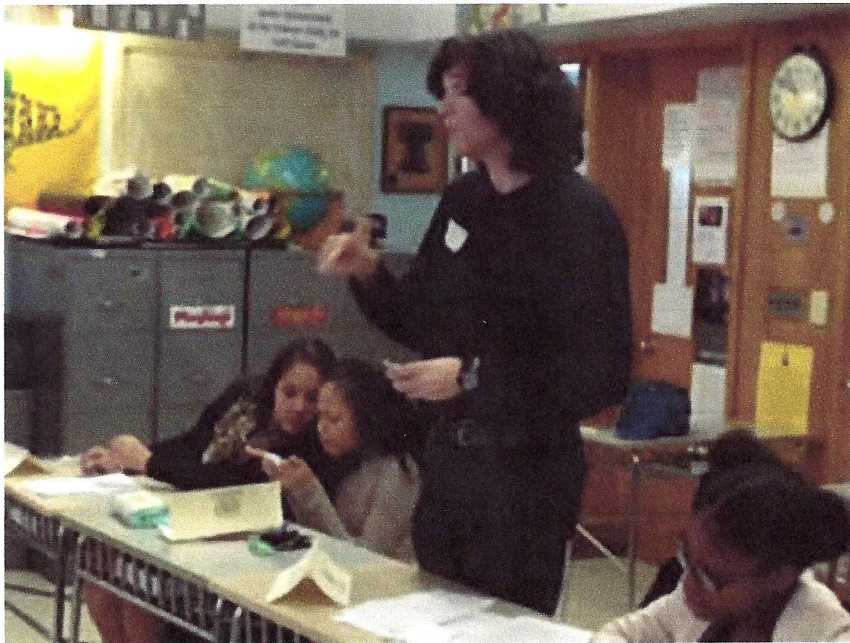
