Link Quay moved to approve the minutes of previous meeting on March 15, 2016. The Motion passed 7 yes 5 no. Motion carried.

President's Report & Chapter Operations - Link Dianne Young

- **The Dance Theater of Harlem activity got rave reviews. Thank you to Links Lisa Stenson Desamours and Claudia Edwards for all of your hard work and effort.**
- **The L.I.F.E. program at Gordon High School was launched. The school is very enthusiastic about the program. It has been embraced whole heartedly by the students, administrators and staff.**
- **Links Are In The House - we are getting many requests for Links participation in various community organizations. We have been extended invitations from the AKAs and For Women Only to put together a table for the Links.**
- **Link Traci was able to obtain 13 tickets for the play Head of Passes. If anyone is interested in attending, they should contact her. Link Traci is looking for a play to attend in the fall for a fundraiser.**
- **Orientation is off to a great start. We have 5 outstanding women. One of the women commented that she felt welcomed and loved.**
- **A vote is needed to move the May Chapter Meeting since it falls on Memorial Day weekend. The proposal to be considered is the third Saturday, May 21. There is a conflict with the Deltas; therefore, it has been suggested to change the time of the meeting to 12:00pm. At the meeting we need to do the Induction and Alumni ceremonies, in addition to holding the Chapter meeting. Link Quay made a motion to move the May Chapter Meeting to May 21st at 12:00pm. - There will be pre-planning at the June meeting for the Chapter Retreat which will be held on September 24, 2016, the date of the Chapter meeting. Links Terry, Ann, and Marilyn are on the committee.
- If we don't have a co-chair for Java & Jazz, we go to members of chapter to discuss budget shortfall and branding at the June meeting. There is a concern that we will lose our following, the people in the community who look forward to this event every year. Link Bettye and Link Claudia were recommended as co-chairs.
- National is requesting that each chapter donate \$100 to their efforts to help provide water for Flint Michigan. Link Dianne will discuss this further with Link Natalie.
- Vision 2020 date was extended to April 24, 2016. There are three members who have not donated. Several members expressed their disappointment that three members have not donated. It was suggested that we should find out why the members are refusing to participate. One member indicated that repeated calls and requests to donate are having the opposite effect.

- **A Legacy Luncheon will be held on April 30th at the Schomberg and is sponsored by Greater New York and their sister chapter from Philadelphia.**
- **Link Terry needs the start and end time for the Committee and Facets in order to give members service hours. Service hours begin May 1.**

Link Terry suggested involving all five Facets and make it an umbrella program. There was a discussion about involving youth in this program. Link Earlene recommended starting without youth and evaluate the program once some of the sessions have taken place. There will be further discussion. Both Arts and National Trends & Services Facets voted to approve the program.
