# Human Trafficking

- National initiatives are programs designed and implemented in response to critical national issues that affect communities of color. **The Human Trafficking Initiative is one of the eleven the national Initiatives and it is under the National Trends Facet.**
- 57,000 to 63,000 people are enslaved and trafficked in the U.S. This is a close estimate, not an exact number due to the challenge in identifying an accurate count (Vera Institute of Justice [www.vera.org](http://www.vera.org))
- Less than 1% of human trafficked individuals are identified according to the U.S. State Department 2010 estimate (Vera Institute of Justice [www.vera.org](http://www.vera.org))

# Human Trafficking

- **OVER 15% OF ALL MEN IN AMERICA PURCHASE SEX.**
- **85% OF THOSE SOLD IN SEX SLAVERY WERE ABUSED AS CHILDREN.**
- **90% OF VICTIMS ARE ARRESTED FOR SELLING SEX; LESS THAN 10% OF BUYERS ARE ARRESTED.**

# Human Sex Trafficking

## Red Flags

- Show signs of physical abuse such as burn marks, bruises or cuts
- Appear malnourished; poor physical and/or dental health
- Have tattoos or branding, particularly related to money, ownership, and/or gang symbols
- Be in possession of large amounts of cash, multiple cell phones and/or hotel keys
- Miss school often, be overly tired at school, be out of school during school hours
- Be caught lying about age/with a false ID
- Avoid eye contact, social interaction, and authority figures/law enforcement


## Closer Look

- Be constantly in the presence of a controlling/possessive boyfriend or girlfriend
- Be protective of and/or submissive to boyfriend/girlfriend
- Seem to adhere to scripted or rehearsed responses in social interaction
- Lack official identification documents
- Be unable or unwilling to give local address or information about parents/guardian
- Exhibit sudden changes in dress or behavior, particularly becoming more sexualized
- Behave withdrawn, depressed, distracted or checked out
- Have new friends with a different lifestyle
- Have a new boyfriend (especially older) who is jealous, controlling, violent, buys expensive gifts
- Show signs of gang affiliation
- Maintain sexually explicit profiles on social networking sites
