The young men in the program are taking AP and honors classes. They are excited about the opportunity to attend workshops to form networks with each other. Presentation by Arts & NTS Facet - Link Lisa Stenson Desamours

- Link Earlene gave the Arts Facet's presentation on sculpting. She displayed some of the extraordinary pieces she created. She shared how she got involved with art during the process of grieving for her mother. She recommended trying to sculpt someone's face or body if you want to start using your left side of your brain. When she was asked how did she know she could create, she said, "I was created by a creator who created me in his image. I am a creator. The greatest sculptor in the world is God. He

uses rocks, wind, and water to create things.” Also, she distributed the pieces made by members who attended the Clay Party at the Clay Art Center in Portchester.

- Link Dozene from NTS spoke in great detail about a very important public health concern that will impact each of us one way or another, Alzheimers. She related that it is an epidemic in our society that cuts across generations. She moderated a very detailed and informative PowerPoint presentation she developed with Link Earlene. Link Earlene added her personal experience with Alzheimers and her passion about raising awareness about this deadly disease. Link Dozene also shared her experience with a family member, as did a few other members. Information was distributed to each member. Link Earlene is advocating for Alzheimer’s becoming a national issue with the Links. Link Dozene stated we must attack the Alzheimer’s Disease epidemic across four pillars:
 - Health & Wellness
 - Finance
 - Care Giving
 - Social Engagement
- Link Dozene spoke about the work of the Chapter at the Wartburg. During their last visit, some of the seniors said we remember you and want the Chapter to come back as soon as possible.
- Wartburg/CAC Art Program - the two Facets are having conversations with the Clay Arts Center about going into the Wartburg to teach clay arts. The Clay Arts Center representatives are excited about this project. Link Yolanda said she spoke to the Wartburg and they are very excited about collaborating on this project.
- NTS’s goals are to collaborate with the Chapter’s Facets to integrate National’s AARP initiative across all facets.
- Link Dozene stated that members should be thinking about long term care insurance. There is a plethora of information about Care Giving and creating Care Circles.
- Some of the contributing factors to Alzheimers are: high blood pressure, diabetes, stress, and lack of exercise. Activities that involve doing something creative are encouraged in order to keep the mind active.
